How did being a campus minister impact your discernment process?

The more I worked in campus ministry the more I got to interact with priests. I saw the lifestyle, how interesting and how cool it was. In fundraising for our campus ministry, I got to meet a lot of people outside of Carbondale. What put me over the edge was how much these people love the Lord. They want the Sacraments and they need more priests.

What has CCMA done taught you over the years?

CCMA has encouraged me in a number of ways. I learned at my first training that you have to find a way to love everything you do. You have to find a way to love cooking a meal for students, or eventually you will not love doing this. If you become stagnated and you don't come to love it, you will burn out. Campus ministry is a slow grind, but the most fun thing is walking with students. The biggest thing for me is that I give people the time of day.


NATIONAL CONFERENCE RECAP
