What's Next?

As the National Study of Catholic Campus Ministry (by the Secretariat for Catholic Education, USCCB) concludes and is analyzed, we anticipate new moments of dialogue in order to expand Catholic campus ministry to even more campuses.

Early indicators from the National Study reveal that Catholic campus ministry has declined in the last 12 years in terms of the number of campuses served.

This is a reason for concern and immediate response.

We believe that the solutions include significant commitment from Dioceses (and religious communities) as well as an enhanced level of collaboration between professional campus ministers and campus missionaries. A recommitment to evangelization and missionary discipleship is necessary in order to focus efforts, streamline resources and achieve maximum fruitfulness for Christ and the Church.
